2 - 9 June 2015, Lviv region, Ukraine

Professional Development of Adult Educators

Aim

To support the education and training of adult education staff in order to strengthen the lifelong learning systems in Ukraine, Moldova, and Belarus.

Target groups

The Summer Academy will gather representatives from three areas where adult educators are being trained:

- **Initial training**, for example, as part of pedagogical university studies.
- **Training/retraining**, for example, equipping professionals in public and private adult education organisations with necessary competencies.
- **Improving competencies** of existing adult educators, for example, providing practitioners with a theoretical framework and introducing new tools.

Approach

International and national experts will provide insights and share experiences from different thematic areas that are relevant for developing and implementing effective training programmes for adult educators in different educational settings.

Participants will relate the experts' input to their own situations and draft vision-based plans of action for creating and strengthening programmes for the professional development of adult educators in their countries. These plans will form a basis for planning DVV International's further support activities in the Eastern Neighbour's region.

Dates

Place and arrangement

Holiday house "Viking Bay" is a large leisure complex, located 12 km from Lvov city on direction to Ivano-Frankivsk. The territory spreads over 15 acres. Materials will be published in both languages, if possible. Consecutive translation will be provided during sessions and working groups / presentations.

Arrival and departure of participants

The organisers will provide a shuttle service for participants from the airport/ railway station of Lviv to the venue on the day of arrival and back to the airport/ railway station on the day of departure.

International travel costs of participants are covered by the regional budget of DVV International.

Booking and ticketing will be provided by the regional office DVV International in Kiev.

List of experts

Susanne Latke



M.A. degree in romance philology and history (university of Frankfurt); M.A. degree in adult education (university of Kaiserslautern). Has been working since 1995 at the German Institute for Adult Education – Leibniz Centre for Lifelong Learning (Bonn) in various positions. Currently she is a research associate in the programme “Teaching, Learning and Counselling” of the DIE’s Centre for Research and Development. Key areas of interest beside the professional development of adult educators include international adult education, EU policy on adult education, lifelong learning concepts and policies. International work has been continuously in the centre of her work. From 2003 to 2010 she held the position of Secretary General of the Consortium of European Research and Development Institutes for Adult Education (ERDI). Since 2008 she has been involved in the coordination of the ASEM LLL Research Network „Professionalisation of Lifelong Learning with a special emphasis on teacher training” (ASEM LLL RN3).

Current projects include the Erasmus+ project ESRALÉ (“European Studies and Research in Adult Learning and Education”), which aims to set up a European PhD programme and research structure in adult education, and, in cooperation with dvv international, the development and piloting of an international core curriculum for the training of trainers in adult education (“Curriculum globALE”).

Larissa Jogi



Larissa Jõgi has PhD in adult education and working as professor of andragogy, she is also adult educator and a member of the working group of Estonian Adult Educators Qualification Standard. She is also the head of Department of Adult Education at the Institute of Educational Sciences at Tallinn University, Estonia. Her current research interests include professional development and identity of adult educators; adult learning in the life course, narrative research, teaching and learning in university.

She has been involved during 1998-2015 in many national and international development and comparative European research projects and conducted several international studies.

During last five years she has been involved in European projects on adult education including the study Adult learning professions in Europe (ALPINE) and the study Key competences for adult learning professionals. She is also editor of the journal Studies for the Learning Society and head of the board of Estonian Adult Educators Qualification Authority.

Larissa Jõgi is a member of European Society of Research in Adult Education (ESREA) and she is currently one of the convenors of the ESREA network “Adult Educator, Trainer Professional Development”; member of International Society of Comparative Adult Education (ISCAE), president of Baltic Sea Region Association for Research in Adult Education (BARAE); member of Nordic-Baltic Network in Higher education, member of the

Estonian Adult Education Council, member of advisory board of European Journal for Research on Adult Education and Learning, expert of the European Union Educational Programmes.

Her current research interests include intercultural adult education, adult education in post-socialists countries, history of adult education and civic adult education.
